

NES Congress Trip to Mexico

03.04.2009 Lufthansa flight Frankfurt – Mexico City

Arrival in Mexico City Your tour guide will meet you and take you to the Hotel. Overnight stay in Mexico City

- 04.04.2009 In the morning you will attend a guided city tour of the 20 million+ capital. Visits include the historical city center and the impressive main square Zócalo, the Cathedral, and the National Palace with the murals by the artist Diego Rivera. The next destination will be the city's southside and the San Angels district where you will have the chance to visit the Arts and Crafts market, which is held every Saturday. The tour ends with a relaxing boat trip in one of the colorful "trajineras" through the floating gardens of Xochimilco, a must-see for any visitors and a popular destination for many Mexican families. Overnight stay in Mexico City
- 05.04.2009 A day filled with highlights! You will start with the anthropological museum and its world-renowned archeological and ethnological collections. Each civilization is given its own hall for example the Olmecs, Toltecs, Aztecs, and Mayans. Afterwards you will have the chance to visit the "Basilica de Nuestra Senora de Guadalupe", Mexico's main pilgrimage site and the destination of thousands of pilgrims from all over the country. Overnight stay in Mexico City
- 06.04.2009 Today's tour leads you to Xochicalco, one of the most important archeological sites in Central Mexico. This remarkably well preserved political, religious, and commercial center dates back to the postmesoamerican era of Teotihuacan, Monte Alban, Palenque, and Tikal. Afterwards you will visit the baroque silver city of Taxco, situated beautifully on a hillside with the opulently decorated church Santa

Prisca. Here you will have ample time to discover the city with its cobblestone alleys, idyllic spots, and numerous silver jewelry stores. Overnight stay in Morelia

07.04.2009 In Morelia you will have the opportunity to learn about the freedom fighter José Maria Morelos y Pavón who is immortalized in a dramatic mural inside the Palace of Justice. After sightseeing Morelia you will visit Lake Pátzcuaro. A boat ride on Mexico's second largest lake leads you to the Island of Janitzio, landmarked by the roughly 40m high tower of Morelos. The next stop will be picturesque Pátzcuaro, famous for its beautifully red and white painted buildings and its multitude of wooded plazas. Afternoon travel to Guadalajara
